Money Matters

We are very indebted to our generous supporters and to our Treasurer Gavin MacKenzie for his expertise in handling our finances. The following summarises his report to the Board of Management for 11th November.

Total receipts were £42,507, including a grant of £17,000 from Highland Council for a hoist at the entrance foyer.

Total payments were £14, 474, of which £10, 724 were paid on property repairs.

Excess of receipts over for the year payments before transfers is £28, 033.

Catering for Youngsters

The traditional YMCA inverted red triangle represents the spiritual (uppermost side), the physical and the social/ mental. We try to reflect this holistic approach to young people and cater for the whole person.

The photograph below gives an idea of the physical activities we encourage, but it is also social as the youngsters of the After-school Club compete together and chat.

Each Monday for the After-school Club we have a 5 minute slot to break from the activities and think about the message of the Bible.

This term we have been looking at the story of creation and the fall with the young people who attend the after school club. Recently we read the story of the birth of Jesus as God's response to the human situation. The young people have listened very well as the message of the Bible has been shared with them.



Veiled?

Have you ever heard the expression, hiding in plain sight? It means that someone is being searched for all around when that person is right there, but disquised.

Isn't it something like that with Jesus? Jewish people were looking for the Messiah, their expectation and hope of national restoration to glory days. Yet when the Messiah came into their midst, they failed to recognise him.

Christian teachers talk of the glory of the Son of God being veiled when he became a human being. **Glimpses** were seen in the miracles and on the Mount of transfiguration. outwardly, he was apparently just like other ordinary men. So that may explain the failure of recognition, and indeed the hostile reaction of religious Jews.

But is there another and deeper reason? This is that there was a veil over Jewish hearts and minds, the veil of unbelief. That veil keeps people today, too, from recognising and following Jesus as the divine Saviour.

Do you see the true Jesus beyond the traditional Christmas card images? Do you see the crucified Redeemer in the child in the manger? Indeed, do you see your Redeemer in the child in the manger? May God take away our unbelief and show us our lovely Saviour so that we will trust and follow him.
